


PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS

My flying associate, Dr. Myron "Ron" Bodman, gave me his back issues of "IFR: The Magazine for the Accomplished Pilot." Yesterday I read an article in which the author had interviewed several full-time flight instructors and examiners hoping to learn from them the greatest problems thev have observed while conducting check rides and IPC's. One of the problems related to the quality of the instrument scan, which in many cases is not all that good. When I was undergoing instrument flight training on a beautiful but turbulent morning my flight instructor took me up in the Skyhawk for some intense training. Both the instructor and the controllers at Akron-Canton Regional (KCAK) demonstrated great patience. returning to the FBO my instructor said, "Hey, ask the guy at the supply counter if they have any instrument scans." So, gullibly, I walked up and asked, "Do you have any instrument scans?" starting laughing and I finally got the joke. I suspect a lot of us could stand to touch up our instrument scans. I think of the guest speaker at our recent convention, a test pilot who has flown many aircraft including the SR-71 When asked if he flies Blackbird. during retirement. he said. because I don't think I could fly enough to retain proficiency." I found that statement humbling and challenging. If a pilot at such an exceedingly high level of competence has such a great concern about retaining currently and experience, we G.A. pilots should be all the more so.


