The following is a personal sharing on my part with NAPP personnel.

After a lot of reflection leading to the New Year I have made the decision it is time for me to step down from some of my NAPP duties. I was impressed and inspired by Pope Benedict's decision to retire from the papacy. My role is, to say the least, a bit different than the papacy but the reasoning is very similar. It is time to step aside so that someone else might continue the work. No one is indispensable.

I took over editor ship of the NAPP newsletter following the 1969 convention in San Diego. At that convention there was a serious discussion on the need for a newsletter on a regular basis. I volunteered to take it over with a commitment to publish bi-monthly, every other month. In the 46 years I have done this I have missed 3 deadlines. Once when I took some college students to Taize, France for a Taize Retreat experience, 2nd when my mother died and 3rd when on a sabbatical in Rome. I have been treasurer for about 20 years.

While the Good Lord continues to bless me with good health and all mental marbles intact, although some might question that, I feel it is time to step aside so that a transfer can be made while I might still be capable of assisting in the transfer.

Rather than present this at the July meeting I thought it best to announce this now so members will have sufficient time to consider filling the two positions I now hold.

In July the following positions will be up for election. President Allen Corrigan has served two terms and is not eligible to run again. The positions of 1st VP John Schmitz and Secretary Phil Gibbs will be on the voting bloc. Although out of regular sequence, the treasurer position will also have to be filled. The newsletter position is appointed, or open to someone willing to take it. For me, the key was to take advantage of qualified people willing to pitch in and be humble enough to use their gifts.

I am a charter member and I have been to 49 of the 51 national conventions. I plan on making it 50 in July. The NAPP position I've been blessed to hold these years has been truly unique and very gratifying. Through the contacts in my position I have come to know in one way or another a tremendous group of dedicated priests and equally competent and blessed associates. As a CFI I have flown with many of you. We've eaten, drank and partied together and through it all one special bond unites us...We are all **PRIEST PILOTS** or the **FRIENDS OF PREIST PILOTS**.

BRIEFS FROM HERE AND THERE

Since "retiring" to Alaska, I have been doing quite a bit of flying – 207 hours in 2014. I am serving six villages in the interior of Alaska: Tanana, Galena, Huslia, Koyukuk, Nulato and McGrath. The typical pattern is to fly out to one of the villages on Friday, visit, celebrate Sunday Mass, then return to Fairbanks on Sunday afternoon or Monday.

When I returned to Alaska I was using the Cessna 172 that I had sold to the Diocese in 1998. Then this past summer, a generous donor from Nebraska donated a 1969 Cessna 182. I flew to North Platte, Nebraska and picked up the airplane. It has been hangared since new and is in excellent condition. It also had a new factory remanufactured engine and new prop, and long range tanks. The radios were a bit old and tired, and it had a Loran. So I talked the Diocese into upgrading to a Garmin GTN 650: Nav, Com, GPS. We also added a Reiff engine pre-heater, new engine, prop and spinner covers. N70901 is one sweet-flying airplane!

We have a hangar for the plane in Fairbanks. In the villages, however, it sits out on the ramp. Winter flying is a bit of a challenge. In addition to carrying the wing, tail, engine, prop, and spinner covers, I also carry electrical cords, and a small Yamaha generator in case there is no access to power at the village airport. Prepping, pre-flighting the plane, then covering her back up on arrival at the village takes almost as much time as the actual flying. Living out of a suitcase half the week gets a bit old. But I am still having fun.

Thank you for your generosity and support. Your donation helps us meet medical needs in parts of Tanzania that are distant from ordinary health care facilities. Flying Medical Service is a nonprofit 501c(3) tax exempt charitable organization. Our tax ID Number is 25-1501364. We have been in continuous operation since 1983. We provide medical assistance to anyone in need, regardless of religious affiliation, ethnic origin or ability to pay. Sponsored by the Spiritan Missionaries and the Catholic Church in the Diocese of Arusha, Tanzania, we strive to help people living in remote areas where sufficient health care and normal communication links simply do not exist.

Flying Medical Service now serves the health care needs in a large part of northcentral Tanzania. We provice regular medical care to dozens of remote areas by means of two single-engine aircraft (see photos above). Flying Medical Service also supplies rural hospitals with medicines and staff and makes emergency air ambulance service available throughout Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda and Burundi.

We see an average of more than 75 patients each day through our regularly scheduled visits to remote communities, mostly among the Maasai people. Patients can come to one of 25 grass-strip locations every two weeks. These vital services continue to operate thanks to donations such as yours which we acknowledge today with our sincere gratitude and appreciation.
