PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS

Dear Members and Friends,

A friend was explaining to me that Bill Clinton could theoretically serve once again as President of the United States. This might happen if the person nominated as a party candidate for president selected Mr. Clinton as running mate for the vice presidential candidacy. Should that party win the election, and the new president be unable to complete his or her term, the vice president would move into that position.

It's really open to discussion whether such a scenario could take place. It's a complicated question, and if it ever came up it would most likely end up being decided by the Supreme Court. The 22<sup>nd</sup> Amendment clearly states that no one could ever be elected president for a third term, but does not stipulate that such a person, if vice president, could not become president if that office was vacated.

But, and this is a very important "but," the 12<sup>th</sup> Amendment states that "no person constitutionally ineligible to the office of President shall be eligible to that of Vice-President of the United States." You might think that would mean the person would have to be born in the United States, be at least 35 years of age and have been a resident of this country for the preceding 14 years. But it might also mean that said person, by definition, could not have been elected to the presidency twice previously.

This is an interesting question which has been argued differently by various "experts." You can read more about it at <u>www.factcheck.org</u>. The point is made there that even if it were possible, the selection of two members of the same family, or two residents of the same state, as running mates, may not be strategically advantageous because of quirks in the rules governing the actions of the Electoral College.

Sadly for me I could not think of any such loopholes that would permit the current president of the N.A.P.P. from extending his tenure beyond the second term. It has been quite an honor to serve in this capacity. But at our upcoming national convention we will be passing the duties to another member.

I know that Mel is getting ready to pass along some of the management chores to some of the newer members. We are certainly grateful for everything that Mel has done and continues to do for N.A.P.P. But we should all be ready to have a careful discussion about the future of the group, and reconfigure in a way that will insure its growth as we move toward 2020 and beyond. Please make plans to come to the convention!

Meanwhile I have not heard back from any of you about my question, raised in the previous newsletter, about the Monday evening of the convention. Did you like the "around-the-table" sharing from all members? Should we do something like that again? Or consider that as a special, one-time-only anniversary sharing? It was nice to hear from all the members in that fashion. But it did go rather long, and I know some of the guys were tired from a long day and needed to rest up for the Please give convention. me some feedback.


