#### THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

When we take to the skies surely safely is our highest priority. One way to stay safe – in addition to keeping current with our medicals and regular reviews – is to fly frequently and make not mere "currency," but "proficiency" our watchword with respect to exercising the privileges of whatever our particular rating happens to be.

With the steadily increasing demands and pressures upon priestly ministry, time in the cockpit is at a premium, thus we have to take advantage of every opportunity to build quality time at the aircraft controls. Discussions on this abound, and it is far outside the scope of this letter to answer that question. One thing is sure however, and that is technology can make us better Priest Pilots.

I'm not referring to GPS, FMS, iPods, and other aeronautical gizmos. Rather, I've found some important pieces of technology that can improve the efficiency of priestly ministry thereby increasing the quality of service that we render to our people while saving us a little bit of time to take that ever-so-important one extra flight per month.

First, I'd like to introduce you to a great website I've found to take a lot of the fuss and fumble out of wedding liturgy planning.

At www.catholicweddingplanner.com you will find a new interface that is destined to become for Catholic weddings what www.fltplan.com has become for the modern general aviation pilot. For our couples www.catholicweddingplanner.com offers a very inexpensive, easy step-by-step guide to wedding planning taking them through a complete menu of the prayers, readings and options for any Catholic wedding.

What saves time here – time that we can spend improving our flying skills and increasing our safety margin – is that as presiders we can customize the choices that the couples see when they log in, so that hour-long meeting when we lay out various options is eliminated since the couples can do that online at their own leisure. Also, for the presider there is a complete customized printout of each individual ceremony, so there's no need to assemble a complicated binder for each wedding.

Best of all, this service is free to the presider, and is completely licensed and approved by ICEL and the USCCB. Also, as an option, if the couple desires **Error!** 

Hyperlink reference not valid. can generate a wedding program worship aid. That meeting we used to spend helping the bride and groom proofread their wedding program? We can use that time studying for our next rating or review.

Another super time-saver that has also improved the quality of service to couples is the PREPARE-ENRICH inventory (www.prepare-enrich.com). If your diocese approves, the Prepare-Enrich inventory is an excellent marriage preparation tool that can help a couple identify their strengths, possible strengths, possible growth areas and growth areas. Facilitator training is required.

And here's another place where an hourlong meeting is saved, trading desk time for Hobbs time. The couples can answer their surveys online at their own convenience, and the presider or wedding preparer does not have to score the profile, rather the completed profile printout is emailed immediately after the couple completes the questionnaires.

Finally, a wonderful piece of technology that has improved service to wedding couples while making more efficient use of time is found at <a href="www.skype.com">www.skype.com</a>, a free videoconference service. All you need is a webcam and internet connection and you can set up a prenuptial conference at a time that is much more convenient for all parties and can save couples travel time to the church office.

I'm not advocating a videoconference in situations where wedding couples are a short drive from the office, however with young couples often living in different places or very far away <a href="www.skype.com">www.skype.com</a> gives us an option to spend more time with couples, improve the quality of our interactions, while saving on travel time. Recently I married a couple from Tennessee who could not drive to Ohio for their marriage preparation.

Skype fit the bill in that case, and we developed a great ministerial connection even though we were never in the same city until the day of the wedding. Right now there is a couple in Cincinnati and we are using the same methodology.

Obviously there are canonical requirements here that need to be observed. I've found that a couple's local priest is happy to give the necessary permission for marriage knowing that the couple will be conscientiously prepared and not given the short-shrift that might sometimes attend to those long-distance weddings. I would recommend forwarding prenuptial files for interstate or interdiocesan weddings through the respective chanceries for a *nihil obstat*, and any required dispensations or permissions.

Using Skype videoconferencing for meetings makes it easier to time shift our important ministerial obligations and improve the level of service while increasing – you guessed it – our time in the left seat.

As quickly as flight technology has been improving, these three technologies: <a href="https://www.catholicweddingplanner.com">www.catholicweddingplanner.com</a>, www.prepare-enrich.com, and <a href="https://www.skype.com">www.skype.com</a> are recent innovations that will help us serve our people better and save us precious time that we can devote to becoming better – and safer – pilots.


