





About NAPP member Fr. Mike Kerin The following is taken from the Spring 2005 GLENMARY CHALLENGE

Pilot, Counsclor, Signer and More

For Fr Mike Kerin, no two days in his Alabama missions are the same - and he loves it!

In Marion, Fayette and Lamar counties in northwestern Alabama, the Catholic Church is known for outreach to those in need. But, adds Fr. Mike Kerin, "We are less known as a prayer-based, Bible-based church." He works on a daily basis to dispel these misconceptions.

Father Mike has pastored Glenmary's Winfield and Fayette missions (Holy Spirit and Holy Family) and reached out to neighboring

Lamar County since 2001.

The three counties he serves have very small Catholic populations (0.7 percent or less) and Catholicism is still a bit of a mystery for many there. He tells of a phone call from a local teacher asking him to make a presentation to her advanced placement students on Catholicism. "She said she understood Catholics to be a 'branch of the Christians," Fr. Mike believes the church tour and his presentation cleared up some misunderstandings.

Ordained in 1988, Fr. Mike knew he wanted to become a priest and that he wanted to serve in a community where there was real need. He found he could do both in Glenmary. "It seemed a good fit," he says. "My ministry offers an outlet to be creative with the gifts and

talents I've been given."

And those gifts and talents are many and diverse: airplane pilot, Spanish-speaker, interpreter for the deaf, counselor, spiritual director.

"Flying is purely recreational," he says. "Sometimes it's good to get away and spend a day flying." There's also an ecumenical twist to his hobby. His instructor is a deacon with the Church of Christ, a denomination that doesn't always see eye-to-eye with the Catholic Church. "We have some really wonderful conversations," Fr. Mike says, "and we have become very good friends!"

Fr. Mike has a master's in pastoral counseling and training as a spiritual director, two specialties needed in his mission areas. "There's only one counseling agency in the five-county area," he says, and only about 15 spiritual directors from any denomination in the

entire state of Alabama.

He loves that no two days are the same - out side of Masses. "I get to work with so many different people and do so many different things," he says. "I'm very lucky."

Fr. Bob Kirsch's Christmas letter came shortly before Easter. It contains pictures of the restoration project of the beloved 210 - QUEENIE. Many of you recall the disaster that almost destroyed the plane a few years ago in the Mexican mountains. After thousands of hours of work and lots of generous monetary and other donations, QUEENIE is back in the air. Bob celebrated his 80th birthday flying medical supplies in the newly restored plane back to the site of the near fatal tragedy.

The story is not only one of Christmas cheer and joy but also one of Pascal mystery. Out of death and dying comes resurrection. The lives of thousands are being enriched because OUEENIE has risen and is among them.

Maybe that is why the letter came in Lent. It personifies all we celebrate as Christians.
