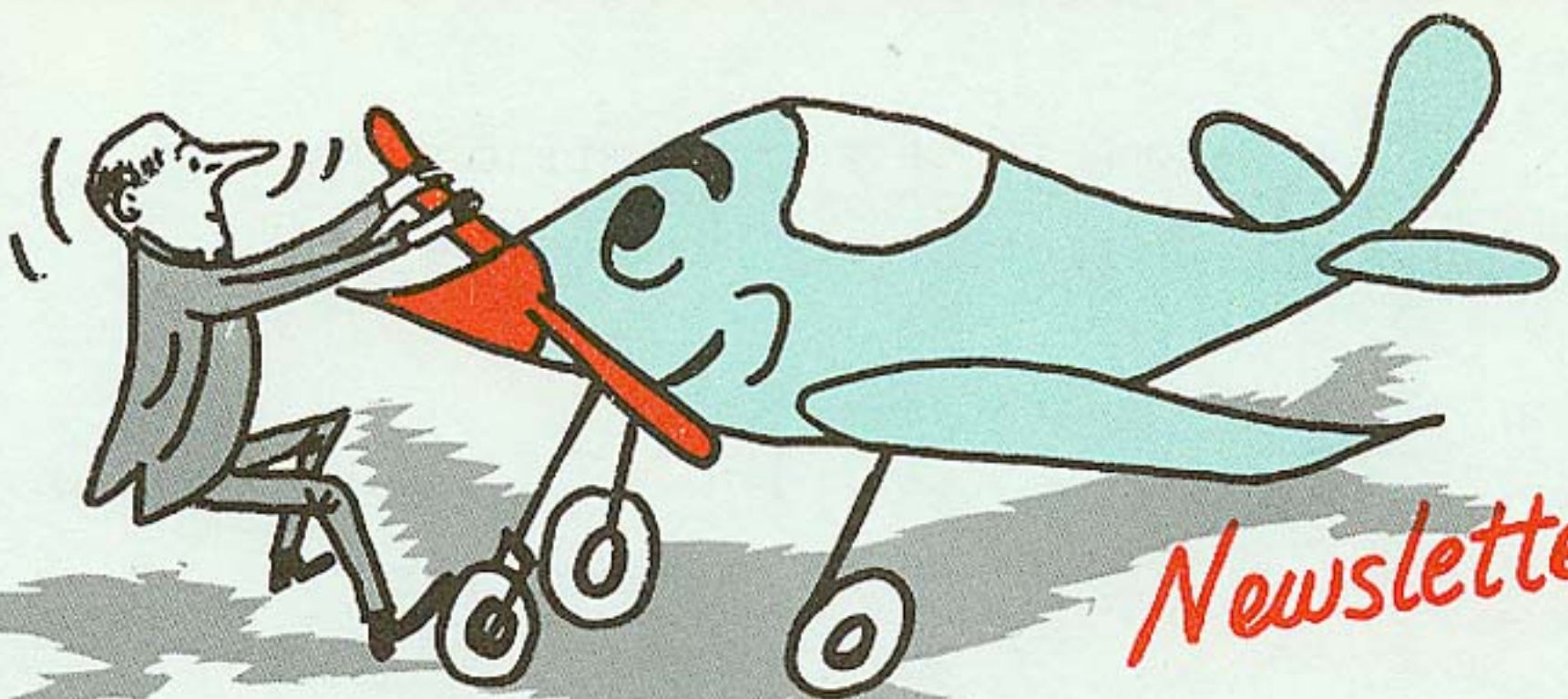

----- ABOUT F.A.A. REGULATIONS (URGENT & IMPORTANT & IMMEDIATE ACTION) A.O.P.A. INSERT

Please read the enclosed carefully and follow the editors suggestion that you write your letter TODAY. The E.A.A. is really pushing hard, along with A.O.P.A., to have F.A.A. hold up on this action. My mail today informed me that over 20,000 letters have already been received but it has moved the F.A.A. to grant a mere 30-day extension to the response period. Congressman Gene Snyder (Kentucky) has introduced a bill in the house of representatives that carries the number HR 2418. Bi-Partisan co-sponsors of the bill include Elwood Hillis (Ind.), Dawson Mathis (Ga.), Gene Taylor (Mo.), Steve Symms (Id), Jim Abdnor (S.D.), Carroll Hubbard (Ky), Arlan Stangeland (Minn), Keith Sebelius (Ka), Tom Hagedorn (Minn), and Larry Hopkins (Ky).

Write your letters to these representatives, especially if you live in their state, and encourage them to continue to support HR #2418. All other members are encouraged to please write, or call, your state representative in Washington IMMEDIATELY and tell them to co-sponsor HR #2418. You can reach your state representative through the congressional switchboard number 202-224-3121. All the congressman has to do is put his name on HR #2418 to become a co-sponsor.

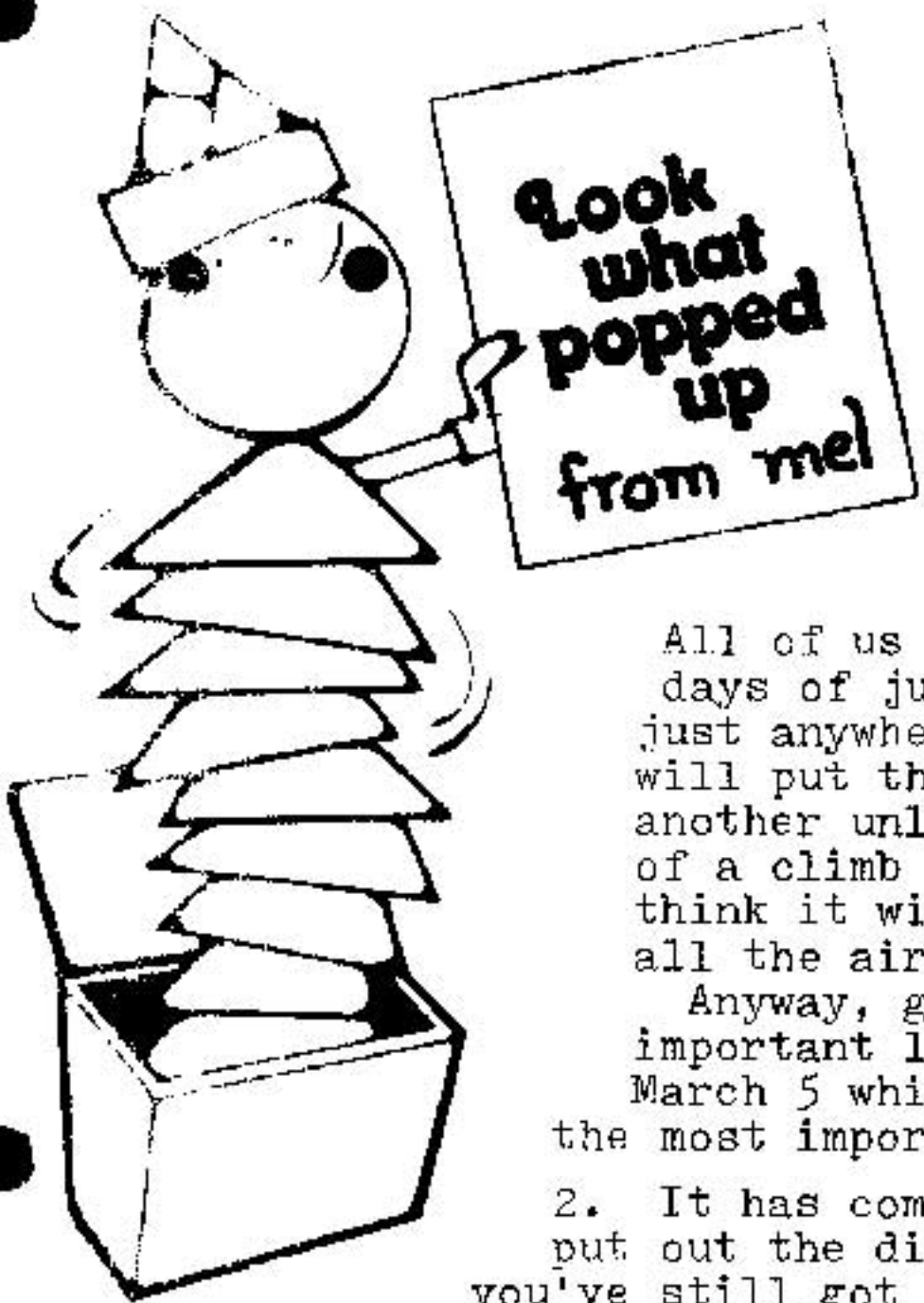

We'd also welcome any other news items you have. We've about run out. The April deadline is Eastern Orthodox Easter, April 22. The letter and directory will be done that week.

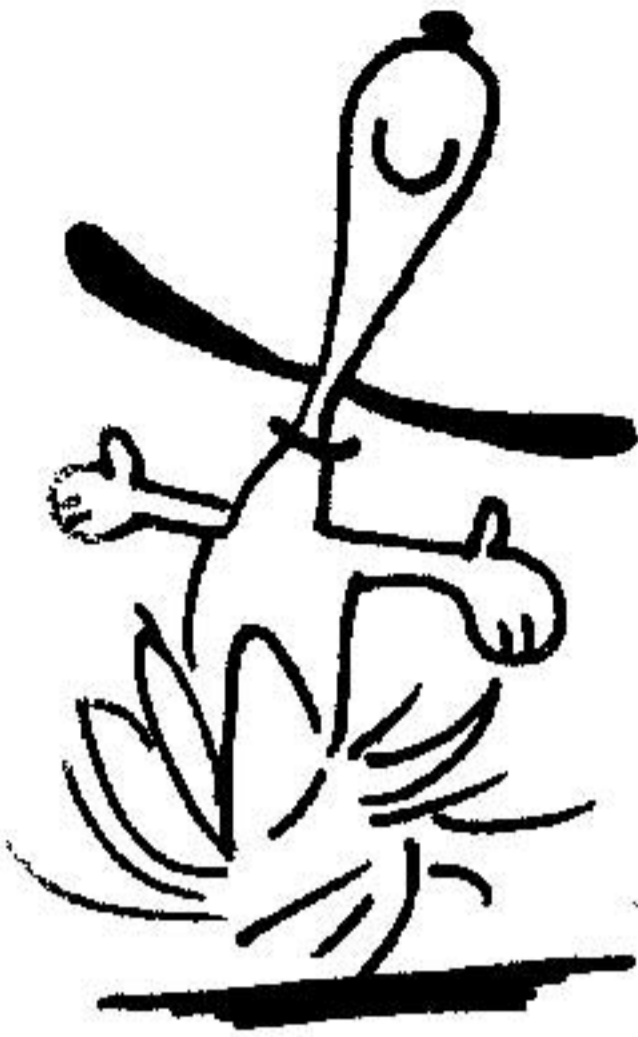
