

It is an honor to serve as the 12th NAPP president. Looking at the Directory, there are 148 priest members


in 32 states and 7 Countries. Three are bishops. One of my goals is to get a few more members ordained to the episcopacy!!



2001 NAPP MINUTES

Little Bar Restaurant - Marco Island - Florida July 11, 2001

Our two-term ending lame duck President, Fr. Ai Werth, seemed more sprightly than lame as he prayerfully opened our 38th meeting at 7:40 PM in the dining room of the Little Bar restaurant on Marco Island, Florida. Much appreciation was expressed to our dedicated hosts, George Gratton and Fr. John "Nobby" Walsh who were ably assisted by Fred Wright. Special attendees were amicably acknowledged: Fr. Peter Geldard from England, Stanley Radzieta (brother of +Fr. Ray Radzieta), Fr. Jim Flavin, Fr. Ray Crowe, CSSR, Fr. Denis Kitenge from the Congo, Africa and Msgr. Frank Mouch. Our housing, along with the hospitality of George Gratton and Fred Wright, was comfortable and inexpensive at Comfort Inn. Our airport fly-in base was the Wing South Airport, Naples, Florida. While most of our 42 attendees arrived by commercial air or by car, nine member airplanes touched down on the Wing South runway: Attea, Gratton, E. Hemann, J. Hemann, M. Hemann, Kirsch, Sweeny, Teufel and Werth. Threatening weather prevented a convention flying event, but we had several ground excursions including Caribbean Gardens, Fishing, Fantasy of Flight and other options.

42 persons were in attendance: 6 Charter Members: Reverends John Bellon, Hemann, Mel Hemann, Bob Kirsch, Frank Mouch and Phil Schmitt. (Bellon and Kirsch have not missed in 38 meetings, Alleluia!); 21 Regular Members: Reverends Tony Attea, Bill Bevington, Ray Crowe, Jim Plavin, Peter Geldard, E. Hemann, Jim Kelley, Merlin Kieffer, Dino Lorenzetti, Mike Nash, Jack Paisley, George Remm, Nick Rossello, Al Ruschman, Jerry Scanlon, Owen Shanley, Peter Sweeney, Charlie Teufel, John Walsh, John Wehrlen and John Wolesky; 13 Associate Members: Jack Boyle, Tim Brown, Bill Browne, Jeff Bryant, Jack Devine, George Gratton, Mike Makelbust, Carmen Marchiole, Mike Murray, Stan Radzieta, Edwina Tabares, Marty Winnert and Fred Wright; and 1 Complimentary Member: Rev Denis Kitenge.

MINUTES: The minutes of our 2000 Anchorage, Alaska meeting were devotedly provided by Fr. Mel Hemann. Motion: That the

minutes be accepted: Gratton/Wright; passed

unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT: A written report was distributed by Treasurer, Fr. Mel Hemann. Comment: There was no submission of any bill by Archbishop Hurley for the 2000 Convention expenses. As of July 1, 2001 our Checking Account balance was \$3,858.93 and our Savings Account balance was \$7,544.06. Motion: To gratefully accept the Treasurer's report:

Boyle/Wolesky; unanimous passage.

CONVENTION 2002: Our New Mexico delegation invited us to New Mexico again for the third time (1978 Santa Fe and 1986 Las Cruces). The convention will be based at Albuquerque, N.M. We plan to visit VLA, VERY LARGE ARRAY, the world's foremost radio telescope array penetrating the secrets of our universe. We will also visit Holloman AFB, the standby landing site for the Space Shuttle. Edwina Tabares, Associate Member president of the FOPPERS (Friends of Priest Pilots) will be the chairperson of the Convention Committee. A show of hands indicated that we might expect 40 persons and six airplanes. Motion: To accept New Mexico for 2002; Wright/Boyle; unanimous acceptance.

<u>CONVENTION 2003</u>: NAPP was invited to Ames, IA by Fr. Ev Hemann and to Maryland by Fr. Pete Sweeney. (Fr. Mike Nash proposed Alaska for 2005). <u>Motion</u>: That we convene in Iowa in 2003; Paisley/E. Hemann; unanimous.

REGIONAL MEETINGS: Eastern: No general meeting; multiple committee phone conferences for the Florida convention. Midwestern: Fr. J. Hemann reported an Oct. 2000 meeting in Waterloo, IA at Livingston Aviation, named after John Livingston, Waterloo native aviator who was the inspiration for "Jonathan Richard Bach's Livingston Seagull." In April 2001 the Midwest members gathered in Nashua, IA for, among other things, an interesting report from Jim Weber who served as Mother Teresa's pilot for her U.S. visits. Western: Fr. Bob Kirsch reported committee discussions for the 2002 convention.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE: There was no Investment Committee report.

MEXICO REPORT: Fr. Bob Kirsch, Western Region director, told of the continuing flights, once or twice a month, into the remote mountains of Mexico transporting, doctors, health workers, paramedic trainers, food, medicine, etc. Our member, Edwina, is still the only flying grandma in Mexico (whom we know of). The tragic death of our Regular member, Fr. Francisco "Pancho" Chavez Acosta on April 8, Palm Sunday of this year in the fatal crash of the Mission Piper Dakota XBETB resulted in a heavy cross for all of us on the Mexico Mission to carry. We have no one of his qualifications to replace him. Pancho was the only priest of the area who was fluent in both the Tarahumara and Tepuan Indian languages. Our prayers and special remembrances at the Holy Altar are requested for the needs of our Mexico ministry.

ALASKA REPORT: The untimely death of our Regular Member Bishop Michael Kaniecki, S.J. on August 6 of last year (within a month of our Anchorage meeting) has been a deeply feit loss for the Fairbanks Alaska diocese. Bishop Mike died suddenly in the sacristy of a Mission Chapel as he was preparing for Confirmation. Fr. Jim Kelley reported that the weather has been generally flyable. The new Archbishop of Anchorage, Roger L. Schwietz, has soloed. Brother Craig, OMI is working on his Instrument ticket. There is a new church out on the Aleutian chain at Dutch Harbor with a resident priest. Holy Mass is celebrated in the canneries in Spanish for the Mexican workers. There are also special ministries to the Samoans and the Philipinos. Fr. Schwarte is flying a C-182 on floats out of Wrangell, Alaska. The Diocese of Fairbanks still has the C-180 and C-207 flown by our departed brother, +Bishop Mike Kaniecki, S.J. Any volunteer pilots, lay or clergy?

DONATIONS: Inasmuch as we had available \$3,000 for donations, due in part to the fact that there was no bill submitted by Convention 2000 host Archbishop Hurley, it was suggested that funds be allotted to three different recipients: 1). Fr. Denis Kitenge for his pilot/mechanic training program; 2). Kelley/Teufel proposing Mexico Mission needs and 3). Ev Hemann/Winnert proposing Alaska Mission aviation needs, specifically assisting Archbishop Roger L. Schwietz in pursuit of his pilot's license. Motion: That all three proposals be accepted: E. Hemann/Rossello;

unanimously accepted. \$1,000 will be donated to each of the three Mission needs.

ELECTIONS: President: Kirsch nominated Teufel; Radzieta nominated Ev Hemann. That nominations be Motion: Kelley/Paisley; unanimous. Vote: Teufel 20, E. Hemann 20. At first Teufel concedes to E. Hemann, then Teufei amends his concession. Teufel had previously refrained from voting; then he cast his vote for E. Hemann breaking the tie. Thanks to Charlie and congratulations to Ev!!! 2nd Vice-President: Kirsch nominates Teufel; Kelley nominates Remm. Motion: That the nominations be closed; Kelley/Schmitt: unanimous. 31 votes for Teufel; Remm Thank George and concedes. you to Charlie!!! Secretary: congratulations to E.Hemann nominates Kirsch; Motion: That the nominations be closed: E. Hemann/Nash. Bob gratefully and humbly agrees to continue on as Secretary.

ANNOUNCEMENT: 1) Prayers are requested for Fr. Art Kleve who 'graduated' from the School of Life into the Fullness of Life on July 6th. 2). Fr. George Remm in behalf of NAPP expresses gratitude to our 2001 host committee. 3). Fr. John Hemann expresses NAPP's appreciation to Fr. Al Werth for two terms of dedicated service as President. 4). George Gratton expresses his thanks to Fr. John Walsh, Fr. John Hemann, Fr. Phil Schmitt

and Fred Wright for their assistance.

NAPP. INC: We continue to be beholden to Fr. Al Ruschman for again faithfully covering our standing as a Non-Profit Corporation in the

State of Kentucky.

ADJOURNMENT: President Al Werth entertains motion for adjournment; so moved by Kirsch (No second needed on motion to adjourn); Unanimous. Convention 2001 adjourned at 8:50 P.M.
