

John Birk of Dayton, Wash. writes, "I am pastor of St. Joseph's in Dayton with a mission Church in Waitsbury 10 miles away. I am also chaplain for the CAP squadron in Walla Walla. I am not a pilot, but I intended to get a license after I joined, but now I don't have the intention, but would like to carry on as an associate member. (I do love to hear what you all are doing as pilots). My interest in you all getting together for fraternalism with your common interest is a great thing and do want to support you in word and through membership. I have decided not to go ahead with a license now because of my intense interest in supporting our mission in Guatemala. It is such a big part of my life I do not at the present wish to depart from it and get involved in learning to fly."

Fr. John Birk of Dayton, Washington, wrote the following on May 20:




"I arrived back from my promotional trip to Guatemala. It took 4 hours and 45 minutes to fly from Guatemala City to Los Angeles. With all kinds of delays and complications, it took  $5\frac{1}{2}$  hours from Seattle to Walla Walla, Washington.

I did come back with about 300 pictures, movies, and some tapes of what is going on in our diocesan mission. The mission work has really grown since I was down in the mission three years ago. The Coop is expanding even to the making of tiles for floors and coffins as well as a thriving business of raising rabbits and sheep and potatoes. Over 1000 of the Indians are involved in the Coop. There is a radio school which reaches out to 128 different areas of our mission and other missions. The regular grade school has an enrollment of 345 children and in the three villages served there are two priests and five

sisters working there. Two of the sisters help with the catechists; one with the medical clinic; one with the grade school; one with the radio school. One priest serves the villages and surrounding areas. In the area served there are about 40,000 people. The location of the mission is between 7000 and 11,000 foot elevation in the mountains which makes flying out of the question.

There are a couple priests who fly in their mission work. The one whom I knew was in the States picking up a plane to fly down and to have surgery done on his nose which was injured in a plane accident last year."


