
John says that because October 4 is Yom Kippur, a day of atonement, he will serve only broccoli and radishes to make up

for all the bad landings this past year.



## CONVENTION 1976




After the Monday night brewry tour and steak fry in the park the group left bright and early for a 3½ hour cruise up Old Man River. Destination: North Buena Vista.

Tuesday evening found all gathered at Robert's for dinner and the annual meeting.






Collins radio of Cedar Rapids
