FLYING PADRES VISIT AOPA

Forty-one members of the National Association of Priest Pilots (NAPP), also known as the Flying Padres, visited AOPA headquarters Wednesday. In town for the group's annual convention, the AOPA members represented NAPP members nationwide, most of whom are Catholic priests with pilot certificates.

"Our two organizations have historically worked together for a common goal - to keep general aviation pilots flying," said Elizabeth Tennyson, AOPA vice president of ePublishing, who welcomed the group.

The priest pilots were given a tour of AOPA's headquarters building and participated in question-and-answer sessions led by AOPA staff members.




Melissa Rudinger, AOPA vice president of regulatory affairs, spoke to the group about topics that are at the forefront of every pilot's mind - airspace and temporary flight restrictions. These hot topics always raised plenty of questions and discussions among pilots, and the NAPP members were no exception. Rudinger also answered questions about FAA funding, flight service station privatization, and Transportation Security Administration security guidelines.

The priests also had questions regarding medical certification. Gary Crump, director of AOPA's medical certification department, was on hand to answer their questions and provide guidance on how to successfully deal with the FAA medical certification process. The AOPA medical staff responds annually to more than 20,000 phone calls and e-mails, answering questions that cover the spectrum of medical conditions from color vision and high blood pressure to kidney stones and heart disease.



NAPP SHOTS AT AOPA, HOOD COLLEGE & SMITHSONIAN





MINUTES OF THE 2005 NAPP MEETING FREDERICK, MARYLAND JULY 12, 2005

Tony Attea were gratefully acknowledged and appreciated.

On Tuesday we toured the DULLES SMITHSONIAN SPACE MUSEUM with the "live" Space Shuttle on display. Among the many historical exhibits was the ENOLA GAY, the B29 of World War II Hiroshima fame. There were many other milestones of aviation

history.

Our Wednesday morning found us touring AOPA headquarters followed by excellent presentations from 3 AOPA staff members. Following a box lunch at AOPA the group

visited the U.S. NAVAL ACADEMY and exhibits at Annapolis, MD. A goodly number of the "ancients" were not up to making the entire "shoe foot" tour and returned early for a break before the Convention Mass at Coblentz Hall after a hands on change of venue by Present Ev and the brethren. The original location, the College Chapel, was not suitable because of the heavy summer heat and a non-operating AC unit. The banquet followed Mass after which a speaker from AOPA further enlightened us.

NAPP SAVINGS: Beginning Balance: \$4,909.36 plus deposit interest 12-31-04: \$104.12; plus deposit interest 06-30-05: \$104.27 resulting in a July 6, 2005 balance of \$5,117.12. Motion: E. Murray/Wolesky: that report be accepted and that "Treasurerness" be gratefully acclaimed; passage. unanimous Motion: Hemann/Wolesky: that the annual dues be \$25.00; unanimous passage. raised Comments: 1). Fr. Bernard McCoy has not as yet been able to set up a web site for us; 2) Suggestion that we list E-mails in the directory.

REPORTS ON INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS:

1). Msgr. Tony Attea advises that Fr. Nick Rosello has been experiencing a heart problem; 2). Fr. Phil Schmitt reports that Fr. Neil Manternach has suffered a slight heart attack; 3), Fr. Bob Kirsch has been battling the big "C" with radiation and chemicals; 4). +Fr. Nate Packard was a "no show" at the midwest regional meeting. +Fr. Nate took off in a light fog and suffered a fatal crash two miles from h is departure airport. Our prayers and Masses are for family and friends and for +Fr. Nate that he forever enjoy the fulness of Love and Peace in the Lord's Kingdom.

REGIONAL MEETINGS:

Eastern Region: Fr. Charlie Teufel reporting: had one day meeting Dec 1 at Naples, Florida with resolution that Fr. Charlie coordinate the 2005 Convention with Fr. Pete Sweeny and that Msgr. Tony Attea cover registrations. Filling out the committee: Fr. George Remm, George Gratton, Fr. Bill Bevington, Fr. Jim Flavin, Fred Wright and Stan Radzieta. (At the convention the following generous donors provided: Tonic Water, George Gratton; Champagne, Retirces Frs. John Hemann, Jack Paisley and Jerry Scanlon; ice-man, John Wolesky. All these efforts were consummately appreciated).

Midwest Region: Fr. John Hemann hosted 19 persons arriving at a Mason City, IA regional meeting. The plant manufacturing ethanol from corn was visited. (Secretary's comment: What a waste! that corn could have been turned into good whisky!) The Region is planning future meetings: 26 Sept in Iowa hosted by the Murray "corporation" and in April at Mexico, MO.

Western Region: Fr. Bob Kirsch reporting: regular flights to Mexico continue; 3 day flying trip to San Pedro Sula, Honduras working as a member of Rotary International in behalf of the victims of Hurricane "Mitch." Phone conferences with Fr. Paul Baseford, Shirley Love, Edwina Tabares and Fr. Richard Olona reference cooperating with Midwest Region re: 2006 convention in the Oshkosh area (the Oshkosh Event would follow the convention). The western Region would be up for the 2007 Convention.

NAPP, INC: Fr. Al Ruschman continues to keep NAPP afloat as a nonprofit Corporation in the State of Kentucky. Kudos to Fr. Al.

Fitzgerald: that Sky Cross, San Antonio be considered. Discussion determined did not follow NAPP guidelines so no action taken. 2). Letter was read from Fr. Sean Thomson, Fairbanks, AK expressing interest in NAPP membership and learning to fly. The president's discretionary \$500.00 scholarship is being sent to assist him in pursuing his private license. 3). Suggestion was made to give Diocese of Fairbanks \$1,000.00 gift. Motion: Kiernan/Gibbs. Passed.

CONVENTIONS;

For 2006: July 11-12, 2006 in the Oshkosh, WI area. (Fr. John Schmitz mentioned that the Museum will be open). Msgr. John Hernann will coordinate the details. For 2007 the Western Region will be hosting, proposing the lower California area.

ELECTIONS:

President: Nominated: Fr. Charlie Teufel and Fr. Ed Murray. Motion: Herzog/Paisley: that the nominations be closed; passed. Nominees left the room for the vote by show of hands. Fr. Charlie Teufel (West Virginia) is the 13th president of NAPP. We delightedly welcome Fr. Charlie, with his long term commitment, to "steer the ship" for the next four years. Second Vice-President: Murray nominated. Motion: Paisley/Ruschman: that the nominations be closed; passed. Fr. Ed Murray joyfully heralded Second Vice-Fr. Phil Gibbs President. Secretary: nominated. Motion: Paisley/Falsey for closure: we eagerly saluted eager and new-blood Fr. Phil as secretary; (And old New Mexico Padre Bob Kirsch after 42 nonstop conventions, pleased with Fr. Phil's commitment, can throttle back and enjoy the brethren and "sistern" more fully).

ADJOURNMENT: at 8:30 PM Fr. Eventertained the Adjournment Motion (No second necessary for our perennial Adjourner, Fr. Phil Schmitt). AND WELL DONE, FR. EV, FOR FOUR VERY DEDICATED YEARS.
