



THE ALASKA STORY

About a month ago Archbishop Frank Hurley called from Anchorage. He told me a long time avid pilot, good friend and big supporter in many ways of the flying clergy in Alaska had died. In lieu of flowers his family established a memorial for the association of The family's intention in priest pilots. establishing the memorial was to offer continued support to the Alaska pilots. Frank received a check for \$2,240,00. Because the check was made out to the Priest Pilots Association Frank sent the check to me. I in turn made out checks to the 3 dioceses of Alaska. Anchorage received \$1000.00; Fairbanks \$800.00; \$440.00. In the past week I received a nice thank you from the three bishops. Bishop Kettler of Fairbanks said he hopes to use some of the money to continue toward his private pilot license. Bishop Warfel said eh money will go toward keeping Mike Schwarte in the air in the Juneau diocesan Cessna 182. Archbishop Schweitz said the Anchorage gift will help defray some of the expenses in getting the recently purchased Cessna 206 in tiptop shape. As a newly licensed pilot Roger says he is looking forward to time in the plane.

In my conversation with Frank Hurley he said, "I could have run the check through our archdiocesan account but I felt this route would give some added publicity to NAPP." In a follow up letter he wrote. "It is fun to give money away. I hope our strategy will prompt others to tap the memory of the deceased for the work of NAPP."

That's an interesting challenge for all of us.

AFRICAN VISITORS





MINUTES OF THE 2003 NAPP MEETING AMES, IOWA JULY 8, 2003

Ever-Ready Ev, our President, Fr. Ev Hemann, opened with prayer our 40th meeting at 6:00 P.M. at St. Thomas Aquinas Parish Hall in Ames, Iowa on Tuesday, July 8th. Fr. Ev is pastor of this parish as well as our Convention host. From copies distributed we all prayed the prayer to the Holy Spirit of God's Love and Truth, the beautiful prayer used before each session of the Second Vatican Council. Lodging was excellent at the Memorial Union of Iowa State University. Your secretary even took a refreshing dip in the Union's delightful Fountain. Our airport fly-in base was Hap's Flying Service at the Ames Municipal Airport. While most of our attendees arrived either commercially or by car, nine member aircraft graced the Ames airport ramp: Attea, Falsey, Funke, Gratton, J. Hernann, M. Hemann. Teufel, Werth and Wolesky.

On Tuesday we had a tour of the six-sided room, C-6 SSOL and wind tunnel along with a virtual accident reconstruction presentation (TWA 800). The annual meeting was held on Tuesday evening at St. Thomas parish hall after which we were graciously hosted with a delightful cookout

WEBSITE: Motion: Attea/Werth: that a NAPP web site be set up: unanimous. Motion: Waish/Falsey: that Fr. Bernard McCoy, Cist. be delegated to investigate feasibility "priestpilots.org"; unanimous. E-Mail for Fr. "frbernard@MonksOnline.org". Bernard is Suggestion: That newsletter could be E-Mailed. Resolution: Officers decide.

NAPP. INC: Once again we commend and are grateful to Fr. Al Ruschman for maintaining NAPP as a non-profit corporation in the state of

Kentucky.

REGIONAL MEETINGS: The Central Regional meetings this past year were wellattended; there was no Eastern meeting; the Western Region met by telephone conference. Future Regional meeting times will be in Newsletter.

MEXICO REPORT: Fr. Bob Kirsch, Western regional director, reported that the Mexico Medical Mission flights to the Tarahumara indigenous peoples of the Sierra Madre mountains of northern Mexico have been temporarily suspended due to the mishap with the SAN MARTIN FLYING MISSION'S Cessna 210, "Queenie." Named after our Blessed Mother, "Queen of the Missions," Queenie will be back in the air by the middle of August, Deo Volente.

ALASKA REPORT: Pre-convention report received by phone by Fr. Bob Kirsch from Fr. Leo Walsh; greetings to all; Archbishop Schweitz, OMI now has his private license. Fr. Michael Schwarte continues flying to outlying mission of St. Catherine's Parish, Petersburg.

CONVENTIONS: 2004: Will be at Frasca Field, Urbana, IL July 6-7. Event will be co-hosted by Fr. George Remm and Rudy Frasca. Fathers George Remm and Ed Higgins provided us at Ames with a neat preview packet with tentative schedule and brochures. Much more to come in our newsletter. For 2005: hosts Fr. Pete Sweeney and Fr. Charlie Teufel are mentioning the Washington, D.C. area and the new Air and Space Museum opening in December at Dulles. Another possibility is St. Augustine, FL. For 2006: Back to the West?
