



AIRPORT CHAPAIN RECOGNIZED AT PITTSBURGH INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

For the last 15 years, Fr. Jack Fitzgerald has been the airport chaplain.

His last day at Pittsburgh International Airport is July 1 when he will report to Our Lady of Peace in Conway where he will be Pastor.

The airport Authority hosted a farewell reception for Fr. Jack in the Airport Chapel today, June 26, 2009

Airport Authority Executive Director Bradley thanked him for his years of service, presented a proclamation from Allegheny County Executive Dan Onorato and presented him with a FlyPittsburgh.com model airplane. "It was chance to say goodbye to a great airport friend and wish him Godspeed," Penrod said.

FAREWELL TO FATHER JACK

Inside Pittsburgh International Airport there is a chapel. "It is an oasis of quiet in a noisy environment": as he likes to call it.

Father Jack's reign as airport chaplain, however, is coming to an end. On July 1, he reports to Our Lady of Peace in Conway where he will be pastor. "It has truly been an incredible experience," he said of his time here. "It has never felt like work. If you love what you are doing, you will never work a day in your life."

Ordained in 1974, Father Jack came to the airport in November 1994, when the airport realized the need for a chaplain. He was assigned b Bishop Donald Wuerl of the Pittsburgh Diocese. A chaplain for the Air National Guard for 23 years, Father Jack combined several techniques into his ministry here.

"I took the military model of being a chaplain and brought it over here to do it civilian wise. Military chaplains are concerned for the morale of the people. You are encouraging people to do what they do to live out their vocation. You are actually helping them to achieve what God is calling them to do," he said.

Working at the airport has come with many responsibilities and excitement. Being a pilot for over 30 years Father Jack got to bring together the two things he loves the most.

"For the past 15 years I have had the opportunity to combine my vocation with my avocation – flying. I combine passion with profession. I am truly blessed to have been able to combine both and not have to make a choice between interest in aviation and my calling from God"

A good friend, Wally Bohl, reflected on Father's time here.

"I met Father Jack when he first came here. What I really liked about him was that he was more than just a priest; he was a champion of aviation. He is the quintessential airport priest. He has a great devotion to God, but an enthusiasm for aviation that went with it. He is a genuine individual who really cares and spreads the good wealth of the industry. I am going to miss him," he said.

When it comes time to leave, Father Jack will miss the thrill, anticipation and diversity that airport ministry has brought him over the years.

"I will miss the excitement and the incredible variety of people that make up the traveling public. You never know who will walk in that door or what their concerns will be. It is a place where people, both worker and travelers, come when they are stressed. People are not always traveling on vacation or business. Sometimes there are very important changes in their lives."

Letter from Jesus about Christmas

If you want to give Me a present in remembrance of My birth here is my wish list. Choose something from it..

- 1..Instead of writing protest letters objecting the way My birthday is being celebrated, write letters of love and hope to soldiers away from home. They are terribly afraid and lonely this time of year. I know, they tell Me all the time.
- 2. Visit someone in a nursing home. You don't have to know them personally. They just need to know that someone cares about them.
- 3. Instead of writing the President complaining about the wording on the cards his staff sent out this year, why don't you write and tell him that you'll be praying for him and his family this year. Then follow up. It will be nice hearing from you again.
- 4. Instead of giving your children a lot of gifts you can't afford and they don't need, spend time with them. Tell them the story of My birth, and why I came to live with you

down here. Hold them in your arms and remind them that I love them.

- 5. Pick someone that has hurt you in the past and forgive him or her.
- 6. Did you know that someone in your town will attempt to take their own life this season because they feel so alone and hopeless? Since you don't know who that person is, try giving everyone you meet a warm smile. It could make the difference.
- 7. Instead of nit picking about what the retailer in your town calls the holiday, be patient with the people who work there. Even if they aren't allowed to wish you a "Merry Christmas" that doesn't keep you from wishing them one. Then stop shopping there on Sunday. If the store didn't make so much money on that day they'd close and let their employees spend the day at home with their families
- 8. If you really want to make a difference, support a missionary especially one who takes My love and Good News to those who have never heard My name.
- 9. Here's a good one. There are individuals and whole families in your town who not only will have no "Christmas" tree, but neither will they have any presents to give or receive. If you don't know them, buy some food and a few gifts and give them to the Salvation Army or some other charity which believes in Me and they will make the delivery for you.
- 10. Finally, if you want to make a statement about your belief in and loyalty to Me, then behave like a Christian. Don't do things in secret that you wouldn't do in My presence. Let people know by your actions that you are one of mine.
