

Dear Relatives and Friends,

Everybody in Wewak was praying that it would not rain on the afternoon of August 15, 1980. Why...because at 7:30 that evening, the new Bishop of Wewak, Father Raymond Kalisz would be ordained a bishop. The prayers were heard, the sky was clear and Wewak witnessed the most impressive reliogius ceremony ever celebrated in Wewak and the East Sepik Province. The Liturgical Service began exactly at 7:30 P.M. with 18 bishops and about 75 priests. All religious communities of Brothers and Sisters were represented and 10,000 or more people filled every bit of the open air arena. The whole ceremony was conducted in Pidgin English and I have never seen such an attentive crowd of people. They prayed and sang together in a wonderful way.

The Rev. Cherubim Dambui, the first local priest of Wewak gave an inspiring sermon. I also spoke....mostly to thank all the priests, deacons, brothers, sisters, catechists, teachers, lay missionaries and church leaders for being such wonderful instruments of the Holy Spirit in dealing with the people. Special thanks also went to all of you for your prayers and material help. Without it we would never have survived. The ceremony lasted 21/2 hours and when it was finished, group singing continued. The people just hung around and did not want to leave.

During the past 32 years, the Diocese of Wewak was divided and new dioceses formed. About 200,000 people joined other dioceses. The Diocese of Wewak now has 200,000 people and 100,000 of them are Catholic.

May I say, thanks again for your continued prayers. Without them the Diocese of Wewak could not have gone ahead. Needless to say, there is still so much to be done and the Wewak Mission and Bishop Raymond Kalisz will continue to be very dependent on your prayers. His address is Box 107, Wewak, Papua New Guinea.


