# Agenda for NAPP Annual Convention

The Convention this year will be held at St. Authory-on-Hudson Seminary, Renssclaer, New York, the major seminary of Immaculate Conception Province, Order of Friars Minor Conventual. Renssclaer is situated on the east bank of the Hudson River just opposite the capital city of New York State, Albany.

The Capital District is a beautiful geographic setting with the Adirondacks on the North, the Catskills to the Southwest and colorful New England to the East. It is 150 miles north of New York City.

Coming north on New York State Thruway take Exit #23, continue north on riverside arterial until you intercept 190, follow the Boston sign to Exit #7, (approximately one mile), turn left at intersection of Exit #7 and Washington Ave. From west or north, take Exit #24 on New York State Thruway, continue on 190 to Exit #7 on east side of river, turn left at intersection of Exit #7 and Washington Ave.






