--- ABOUT THE LONG WINTER

Here in the midwest we've had new records set. Where I live, in Waterloo, Iowa, we set a new record for number of consecutive days when we were below zero and number of consecutive days when the temperature was below freezing. We also had our share of snow. Our school system missed five days of school during December, January and February so we'll be making those "snow days"up in June. Gosh, it's hard to conserve energy when the winter brings such experiences.
