#### THE 1986 MILE HIGH AIR DERBY RACE COURSE TO CHALLENGE

The Derby is sponsored by the Colorado Chapter of the 99s and is an air speed race open to all female and male pilots. The entry fee of \$50.00 covers both pilot and co-pilot.

The Derby is scheduled for September 12, 13 and 14. The starting point will be the Front Range Airport east of Denver at Watkins.

After departing Front Range, the racers will make a fly-by at the Flagler Airport, on to New Mexico to a mandatory stop at the Raton Municipal-Crews Airport. From Raton on to a fly-by over the Las Vegas Airport, finishing with a fly-by and full stop at the terminus, the Santa Fe Airport.


The new race course has been designed to offer new challenges to the experienced racer and a unique learning opportunity to first time racers. The course will demand careful and thoughtful navigation.

The entrants will be limited to the use of stock model aircraft between 140 and 570 total horsepower, with scoring based on times and aircraft handicapping.

While there will be the choice cash prizes, \$1000 for first place, \$500 for second, and \$200 for third, and trophies, many other excellent product prizes will be given. The Derby will be limited to fifty entries.
