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
There is plenty of enthusiasm in nature during springtime and summer.



Dear Mel,

I hope you have been having a good hibernation. The cold and damp should be vanishing from mid-America about now! Soon it will be safe to return from Florida!

We have been marching along in the Bay Area, too! I have had a change in working days at Palo Alto and Menlo Park. Now I go down every Thursday and Friday, and every other Tuesday. Tuesday is the bad day, with a commute each way. I leave about eight or eight-thirty in the morning and get home at about seventhirty in the evening. On Thursdays I go down at about the same time, stay with Lou Andre Thursday night, and come home Friday night. Works better, but the commute has to go.

On June first, I'm moving out of Good Shepherd and going to Mount Carmel in Redwood City. Jack Kavanaugh is pastor. Jack is in Rome on Sabbatical, and won't be home until May 20, so the deal isn't final. He is losing an associate and will have the room. His parish is only about five miles from the hospital.

I'm sorry to leave father Louie, pastor of GS and the friends I have made here, but seventy miles is not impossible once in awhile for a visit. And the government will move merom coming in and packing all the stuff, to putting it back on the shelves at the destination.

I'm going to have the movers on June first, then going to Rochester on the fourth, while they store the stuff, then move into Jack's when the room is ready on my return. If necessary, the government will give me sixty days at \$66.00 per day if I have to live in a motel for awhile.

A month ago I had a little incident with my heart. It was a Thursday night. I awakened about three in the morning and felt a flutter in my heart. There was no pain, just a funny beat. When it was time to get up it was still there, so I went up to Emergency. They were great, gave me all sorts of tests, and said, "You are right. You have a ventrical flutter." They kept me until Sunday noon, but they got it regularized by Saturday. They want to look at the heart, to see if there is anything irregular about it. But it has been doing the job ever since. And I am feeling fine. So, I had a follow-up Echocardiogram the other day and all was serene.

BISHOP JOSE LLAGUNO, S.J.

I received a letter from the Vicar General of Jose's diocese. It was in Spanish so I sent it to Bob Kirsch for a translation I could put at the end of the Spanish. I kept the original and when Bob gave me the translation over the phone I didn't bother getting the correct spelling of the Indian tribe Jose ministered to. When the time came to put all this together I discovered I'd thrown the original away along with all the other notes; letters, etc. when cleaning up after putting this letter together. So what follows is a summation of the thoughts Bob shared on the phone. Bob will give a report at the July convention.

"I received the last NAPP communique April 1992 sent to Bishop Jose LLaguno. At this time I want you to know Bishop Llaguno died on 26 February, 1992 as a result of cancer of the pancreas. Some weeks ago I asked Fr. Bob Kirsch to contact you with this news and asked that he do me the favor of sending you a resume' of the work of Bishop Llaguno in the mission to the Tarahumara people of Mexico. I asked him to do this because I know very little English. I ask your prayers for Bishop Llaguno as well as for this church of the Tarahumara people. Especially during these months when we are occupied with the determination of naming a new bishop. For the time being our airplane remains grounded until the new bishop decides what will be done with the plane. We are counting on another priest who is also a pilot, Fr. Jose del Campo, S.J. But for the moment the plane is not in service.
