Our Parishioners, indeed all of us, are subject to more stress and depression during longer nights and bleak weather.


Flying, together with vacation time, regular physical workouts, fraternal companionship, etc., can be healthful therapy. Besides, it's cheaper than the hospital.




dues your new membership card is enclosed. If you haven't mailed in the \$15 we are including another dues envleupe for you. Please return it as soon as possible. Thank you.



5 A S S O Y A

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Porty years ago I walked through the jungle from Wowak on the North Coast of P.N.G. to Sassoya, that was a day's walk. I had just been appointed the new bishop of the clocese of Wewsk. Sassoya was one of the parishes that I needed to visit. Three years of war had left Sassova a sad place. No priests had worked in the diocese of Newak during the war. They had all been killed or evacuated. Now I was there in Sassoya for the first time in my life. The church and father's house were falling apart. All such buildings in the jungles of F.N.G. were made of poles, leaves and back, held together by vincs. They deteriorate in about 7 years. The people scened depressed. The new, recently appointed priest was trying to get a bit of spirit back into the people. He had to start from scratch. Wewak. There were new so many things to do.

The years rolled by. Sassoya started to revive. Some of the jungle was cleated to make a little airstrip. That meant that a small plane could fly from Wewak to Sassoys in 7 minutes. My pilot's licence now became very useful. A small portable saw mill was brought into Saasoya. Little by little the rough boards for a church and school were out. Catechumon classes grew larger. Raptisms increased

dramatically. Once a year I would fly in for confirmation.

Father Ivo Buiter, an expert birdraft orgineer and pilot did a lot of flights to Sassoya with the dargo and people needed to run a Wission parish. Often he carried sick people out, to the hospital in Wewak. Wooden flooring was out into short pieces on it would fit into the lillle airplane. The new Eather's house, therefore, got a wooder floor instead of a shaky bark floor. School children could now learn reading and writing along with categorism.

The years rolled by. When 30 of them had passed, Rome transferred me from Newak to the Archdicese of Andany, which is next door to Wewek. Ten more years alipped away, and I turned the corner at 75. That is the age at which all bishops are asked to resign. My resignation was accepted about a year later. Archbishop Benedict To Varpin was appointed. He is a local person from the Island called New Pritain. He is doing just fine. I am still doing a hit of flying. I do the 1 hour and 25 minutes

flight from Madang to Wewas whenever something important happens in Newak.

Some months ago, I flow there to take part in the 75th muniversory of the parish of wawak. Very recently, I received a most welcome letter from Lwo Sisters of the Rusary in Wewak. They said they were from Sassoya and were getting ready to make their final vows. They wanted to do that in their home village, Sassoya. Would I come and receive their vows? That suited me just fine. When the date drew near, I flow to Nowak. The bishop of wawsk, the most Rev. Haymand Kalisz, 5.V.D. and I drove to Sassoya. The trip took one nour and thirty minutes. I had not seen Bassoys for about 10 years. The Sassoys air strip had returned to jungle. It was no longer needed. My romony reminded to that I had walked to Sassoya 45 years ago. I remembered the old church made of poles, leaves, bark and vines. That was all gone now. I remembered that I nearly lost my life there about 25 years ago, when I overloaded the plane with seed plants to take to the Supik River area, where Floods had destroyed all the people's food gardens. It was almost hard to believe that 40 years ago everything started again with Grade One. Now there were two educated and qualified Sassoya Sixters ready to make their perpetual vows. It was also encouraging to learn that there are 3 other Sassoys Sisters who sie in temporary vows. Another source of satisfaction was the fact that some Sasseya boys are studying for the pricathood.

Dather August Knorr, S.V.D., the pastor of Sassoya for the past 21 years, said, "It is time to start." The drows rumbled and Bishop Raymend Kalisz and myself, with an impressive array of Missionaries

and servers processed into the new, ever crowded church. Bundreds more were standing outside.

The solemn deremany started with pomp singing and dancing. It was an impressive nument when the parents of the two Sisters prosented their daughters to God and to the Church. The biggest moment, however, was when Sister Victoria and Sister Maria Corotti came up to the altar and promised poverty. chastily and obodionse for life. There was a moment of silence. The the con-celebrated Mass continued with the coronomies at their best. The kiss of boace was sincere and universal. It was a day I will never forget.

You, who have reed these lines thus far, are among that special group of people who have provided much of the natural and spiritual power that made it all happen. I hope you will persevere with us in our work of planting the Catholic Church at the ends of the earth. Do keep praying.

'PEANE' PARISH LOOKS TO HEAVENS

The Rev. John Dompka and his parishioners look to the heavens in more ways thin one.

Dompka. 70, a licensed pilot, is pastor of St. Margarel Mary Roman Catholic Church, located on a hilltop near Greater Fittsburgh International Airport.

Many in the congregation of 1,500 families work at the mirport, and Dompka said he sometimes flashes

a photo of an airplane on the audio-visual display screen behind the church altar.

*To get their attention inrediately, I sometimes use my aviation experience in my sermons," he said. The congregations enthusiasm for flying can be seen on the church's stationery, which features a picture of an astronaut. It includes this note: "Saint Margaret Mery Courch, a parish of plane people with a special air about them. Saturday evening mass at 6:30 to accommodate carthlings."

Dear Priends,

Happy Christmas: From Africa this year, my hopes for each of you are that you are well and happy and shill excited about life.

As the cod of 1989 approaches and the beginning of the last decade of the second millennium, major events -- hope filled events -- seem to be overtaking our world.

On a much amaller scale Olkokola mission and the Plying Medical Service share in the excitement. Recause of the generosity of many of you, we have just put Into service another discraft. We now have two very tough and very beautiful michlanes serving on a regular basis the medical needs of remote areas in this part of the world. We are able for the first time to offer comprehensive health care programs throughout the whole 30,000 square wile area of Arusha and parts of the surrounding dioceses, as well as providing emergency service throughout the country.

In somewhat the same vein, Olkokola Technical Training Center has become -- I believe -- more responsive to the deeper needs of the community. From a single rural training center, we have changed its focus to helping physically bandicapped young women and men to work as callors, carpenters, masons, and experts in agriculture and animal husbandry. Again, with your help, both moral and financial, we have been able to provide many of the students with artificial limbs, new skills, and new hope to carry back to their villages. Our efforts with 30 students are still small. But we are also still young.

Also young is this country of Panzania. Over the past several years, rapid and radical changes have been taking place in the political and economic structures. Many seem to be very good, many also bring with them new difficulties.

50 the Christmas excitement -- and sometimes terror -- that surrounds new birth is present here, ex I trust it also is in your lives. May your own struggles all be worthwhile, your dark days turned light, and your bright days well shared with new and old friends.


