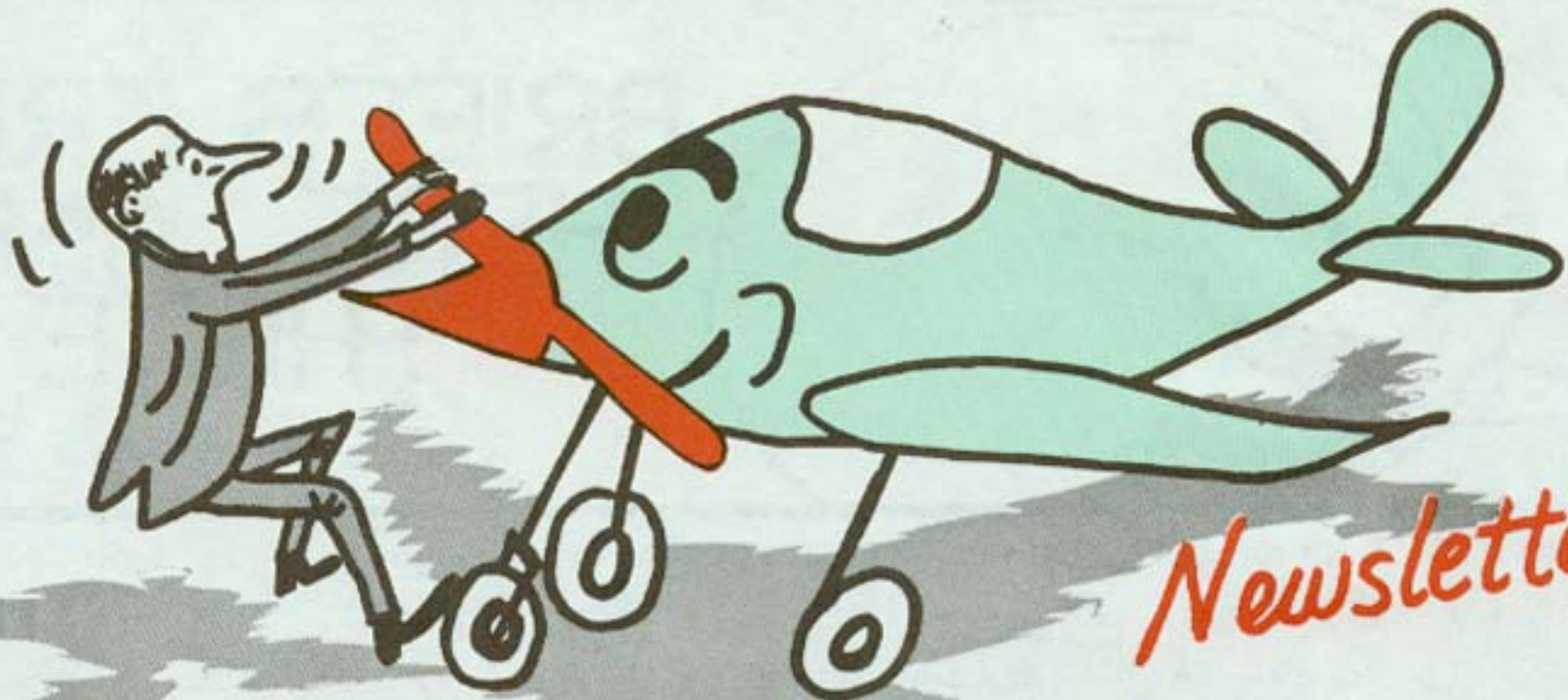

THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



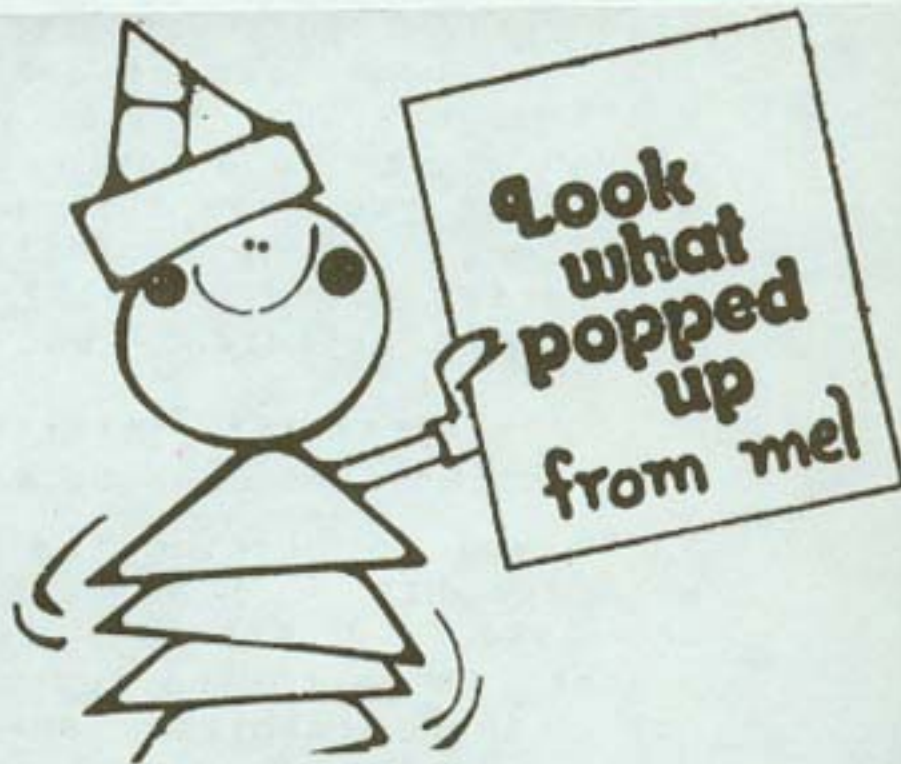

I have been your Pastor in St. Thomas More and St. Teresa for the past ten years. As I look back over these years, I am awed and overwhelmed by the love and the warmth that each of you displays to me personally. I look back over these years and I am aware that we have had massive turnovers of parish population almost every three years due to change of station in the Embassies and the Military Services. And yet, each time, I am heartened by the fact that every three years, there are always new, generous, - and this word includes more than financial needs of the parishes, which indeed you are - loving people who take over the work of the parish for God's love and cause.

I am somewhat ashamed every once in awhile when I think of how much each of you does for God's work in our Parishes and how little I really do compared to you.

This note does not mean that I am leaving the Parish - not for some time yet! I just want to use this opportunity, especially after the last two occasions of our First Communion and Confirmation, to let you know how much I love you all and how much I appreciate each one of you. There is a saying somewhere along the line - if children and dogs like you, you must be OK. Fursty likes me (she had better!) and there is a love affair going on between me and the children of the parish - and you will never really know how much I treasure the love of the children - and the adults, too! God bless and love you all - I do!

Thank you for taking the time to respond. I do know of all your work for NAPP. I am listed in the Directories for 1964-65, 1985, and 1986. I attended the second convention in Duncan, NE, and planned to go to the fourth convention in Boston, but got weathered out. Then Archbishop Sheen assigned me to start a new parish in Webster, NY, in the Spring of 1967. Things got busy and I lost touch with NAPP until a few years ago. I got Bill Roche (CFII), my

flying partner of the past 10 years to sign up, and we made the meeting last year in Pittsburgh. I am planning to be at the convention in Frankfort, but Bill is leaving on Sabbatical. So I am planning on driving instead of flying.

The enclosed letter to Bob & Mrs. Wendeln brought no response so Al Ruschman and I telephoned them this afternoon to hear that Bob is DEAD! BOB DIED IN A COMA on Thanksgiving Day last November after suffering an aneurisym at the new home in Baja, California some days earlier. His body went to Medical Science and his corneas were donated and grafted on a living recipient. A priest friend held a memorial service according to the widow who is very distraught. No word of Bob is on file in the Covington Chancery office for years but the widow did promise to send an account of death and burial to NAPP and I invited her to come to the convention anyway and say something about her memories of Bob. She said she may do that as she intends to return to her relatives in N. Ky. shortly. Very strange -- no notice to Covington chancery or to NAPP.


I intend to be careful with my cancer revival to see that - God willing - I don't add to the statistics. Radiation seems to be clearing me up but especially all the prayers.

Frank Ament, 73 Bayshore Way, Goodland, FL 33933, attends Marco Island Church where I helped this past season. He is a friend of Tony Gendusa and helped with Wings of Hope..operated the Sandwich Illinois airport for 30 years and knows Jerry Mock who flew a plane out to Gendusa..he is hoping we can get in touch with Mock and invite her to the Frankfort Convention....I asked him to help us look for her.

Al is doing great on the convention and has 25 registrations to date..hope all presidents can make it and glad to learn that Arkfeld will be there if possible.

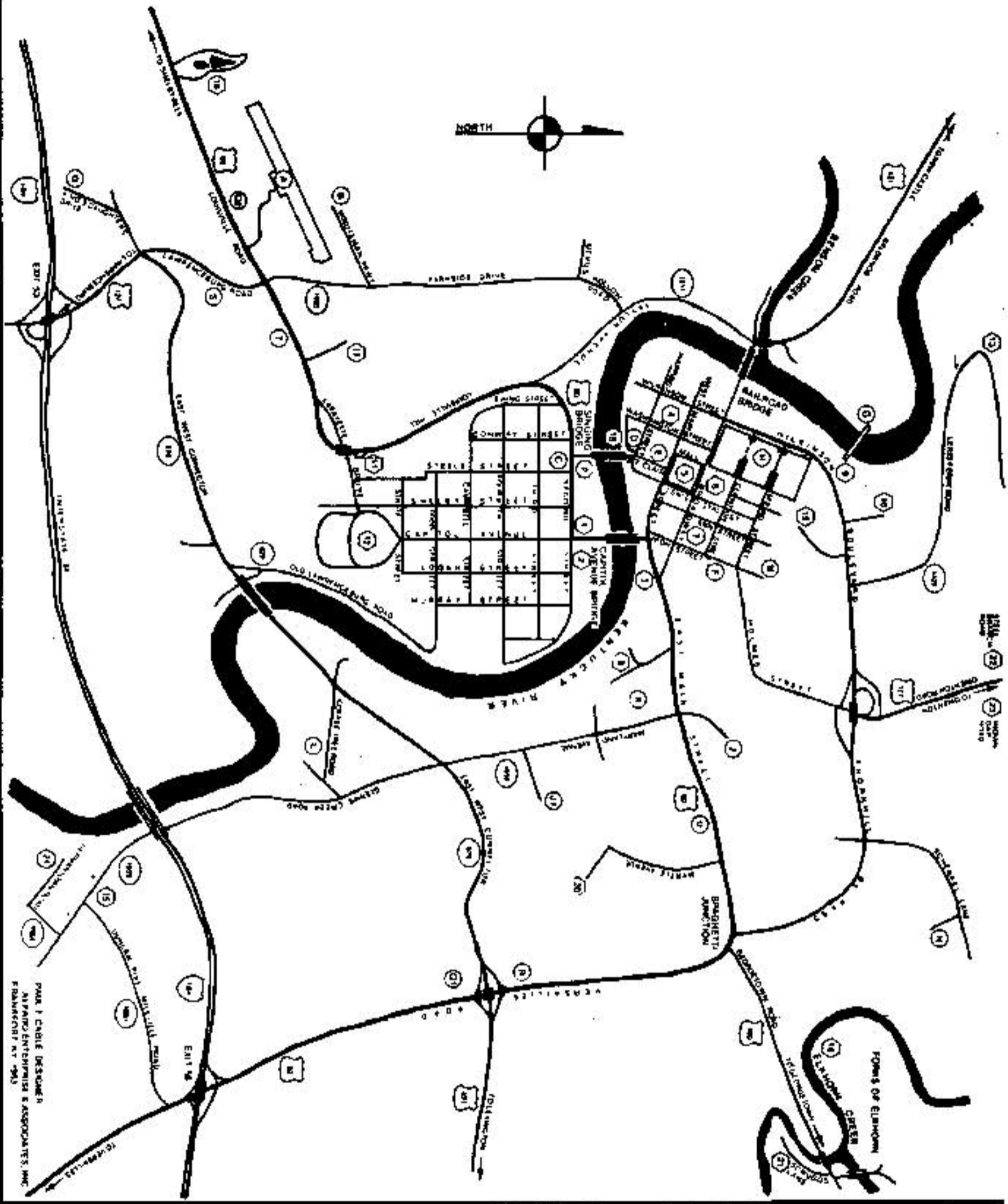
