

One thing we did enjoy, at least most of us, the "tail wind" on the way home.

There were a number of priests, and I will not name them, who were very generous with their time and provided the use of their rental or personal car. This did in fact save us over \$200.00. Furthermore, when it came time to paying for the rental cars and van it actually cost us approximately only 62% of what the original price that was quoted. A financial savings again.

Now MORE GOOD NEWS. Because of a few breaks, and cost changes after I worked out the original convention fee, the 1993 Convention MADE MONEY. You will be happy to find a deposit into the treasury report next year from the 1993 Convention. It all comes about because of a number of people, and agencies, who were CHARITABLE.

For 30 years we have been "giving" money away each year to assist others. It is true, "give and it shall be given back to you". Let us keep up the spirit of "gift giving".

It seems that the end of the meeting comes too fast and all are gone back home. All of us have wonderful memories of the meetings we have attended.


By the way, I will take some timeout one of these days to look up minutes where we discussed the guest payments, etc.

# NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF PRIEST PILOTS

## MINUTES FOR THE 1993 ANNUAL MEETING

Our venerable 'lame-duck' brother President, FR. FRANK NEMMERS, opened our 30th meeting at 7:05 PM, July 7th, at Our Lady of the Pillar Retreat House in San Antonio, Texas. Our Convention host was FR. JOHN HEMANN who, with FR. MEL HEMANN and FATHER EV HEMANN assisting, did a yeoman's job (there was no NAPP member in the San Antonio area to help). Appreciation was also expressed to FR. DICK SKRIBA, to FR. ED HIGGINS and to MR. BILL BROWNE who shared their cars for our ground transportation, and to YOLANDA. 32 members were present with 4 Associate members and 1 guest. FR. JACK PAISLEY had asked to be excused but did volunteer himself for reelection as 2nd Vice President. The absence of all other missing members was appropriately mourned!

- 1. Copies of the MINUTES of our 1992 meeting were distributed and perused. MOTION: FR. BEN BAUER/FR. BILL ROCHE: THAT THE MINUTES BE ACCEPTED: vote was unanimous.
- TREASURER'S REPORT: FR. EV HEMANN reported a Balance of \$6,776.64. In addition there was a \$680.00 refundable deposit forthcoming. MOTION: FR. CHARLIE TEUFEL/FR. ALRUSCHMAN: THAT THE REPORT BE ACCEPTED: unanimous vote. FR. PETER SWEENEY suggested that a gift be made to FR. JIM KELLEY now working in the Anchorage Archdiocese with our member ARCHBISHOP FRANK HURLEY. Discussion ensued during which it was recalled that last year. 1992, we had wanted to give a gift to FR. PAT PATTEN in Africa, but that our funds were too limited. MOTION: FR. AL RUSCHMAN/FR. EV HEMANN: THAT THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE DECIDE UPON A GIFT, WHATEVER WE CAN AFFORD, TO FR. PAT PATTEN FOR THIS YEAR. 31 in favor; 1 opposed.
- 3. 1994 CONVENTION: FR. BILL ROCHE, San Francisco area, volunteered to host for 1994; he was duly applauded; airport of rendezvous, possibly San Carlos or Palo Alto; FR. MIKE NASH (from Juneau) might be able to help from Bay Area. Dates will be July 12 and 13, 1994, the good Lord willing and no more high water! FR. JIM KELLEY conveyed regards from ARCHBISHOP FRANK HURLEY who again offered Anchorage for our convention. For 1995 OSHKOSH was mentioned by FR. JOHN HEMANN. Would be previous to EAA Fly-In, on our regular dates, i.e., Tuesday and Wednesday of the first full week following July 4. Perhaps BISHOP SKLBA would be our host, perhaps at the Retreat House.

- 4. <u>GUEST SURCHARGE</u>: Discussion was had about a \$10.00 surcharge for guests which had been in place at some time in the past, <u>MOTION</u>: FR. JACK LAWLER/FR. CHARLIE TEUFEL: THAT ANY SURCHARGE BE RESCINDED: Vote was unanimous.
- 5. MEXICO REPORT: by FR. BOB KIRSCH: The aircraft, a Cherokee Dakota 260; XB-ETB, of our departed member BISHOP JOSE ALBERTO LLAGUNO FARIAS, S.J. is still in the hangar at the central Mission of Sisoguichi, Chihuahua. 808 makes sure that maintenance is kept up to date. However, since there still has not been appointed a new Bishop for the Tarahumara Indian Vicariate, ARCHBISHOP JOSE FERNANDEZ of Chihuahua City, Administrator pro-tem of the Vicariate, has directed that theplane not be used until we see what the new Bishop will decide. Some members who had been supporting the Mexican plane are now assisting BOB with the SAN MARTIN FLYING MISSION'S C-210 which serves the Tarahumara People of Mexico on a regular basis. FR. BOB is very grateful for this support.
- 6. A SPECIAL PLAQUE was presented to FR. MELHEMANN through the thoughtfulness of FR. NICK ROSSELLO to appropriately honor MEL for his 30 years of service to NAPP, especially as Editor of our fantabulous Newsletter. Congratulations, MEL!
- 7. HONORABLE MENTION TO MEMBERS:
  1). FR. JOHN HERZOG for his 'hole in one' on his trip to Israel; 2). FR. JOHN BELLON and FR. BOB KIRSCH for having made every one of our 30 meetings; 3). FR. PETE SWEENEY for not only having paid his dues on time (really supererogation for PETE) but also for paying dues for our new member, FR. JIM TRANSUE: 4). FR. BILL BEVINGTON (assisted by Public Relations Directress, MS. COOKIE CALLACHAN) for securing for us free passes for our wonderful day at FIESTA TEXAS, thereby saving us hundreds of dollars! 5) FR. RAY RADZIETA (attended his last convention in 1992) who is still playing Bridge with FR. CHARLIE TEUFEL.
- 8. NAPP. INC.: FR. ALRUSCHMAN has sent in, on his own nickel, the required fee to keepus INCORPORATED under the laws of the State of Kentucky. Thanks much Al! (mention of Kentucky always brings back fond memories of our Founding Fathers, +FR. HENRY HAACKE and +FR. BOB WENDELN. May they both rest in Peace

and Joy 1.

9. FLECTIONS: For President: FR. BOB KIRSCH nominated FR. TOM GEELAN, MOTTON: FR. EV HEMANN/FR. JACK LAWLER: THAT THE NOMINATIONS BE CLOSED; Unanimous. Congratulations, FR. TOM is the former administrator of Kuemper High School in Carroll, IA and now pastor in Boone, IA). And heartfelt appreciation to FR. FRANK NEMMERS, our out-going President, for a very fine job! For Second Vice-President: FR. BOB KIRSCH nominated FR. JACK PAISLEY (in absentia...not KIRSCH, but PAISLEY) for reelection. MOTION: FR. ED MURRAY/FR. JOHN WOLESKY: THAT THE NOMINATIONS BE CLOSED: Unanimous. Congratulations and thanks again to you, JACK! For Secretary: FR. JOHN WOLFSKY nominated FR. BOB KIRSCH for re-election; FR. BOB KIRSCH nominated FR. JACK LAWLER who declined. MOTION: FR. BILL ROCHE/FR. CHARLIE TEUFEL: THAT NOMINATIONS BE CLOSED; Unanimous. BOB expressed his appreciation for the confidence of the members.

10. FR. DAVEHOGAN provided a tape on THE GREAT ART OF FLIGHT; really hilarious! Thanks, DAVE! FR. JACK LAWLER commented on CHARLIE SWEENEY, pilot for the Nagasaki bombing. For the Hiroshima mission there were three planes in the group; the first plane, a B-29, the Enola Gay, commanded by Pilot Tibbits, was armed enroute. For Charlie's bomb run the A-Bomb was armed prior to take off.

11. President, FR. FRANK NEMMERS, invited FR. BOB KIRSCH to comment on the Mike Wallace 60 MINUTES segment. BOB gave a report on

"the Rest of the Story" and on what actually happenedas Mike Wallace accosted the Religious Procession (Mr. Wallace had actually been looking for Archbishop Sanchez who was not present). BOB did file criminal charges of Assault and Battery onMike Wallace for accosting the Pilgrimage and for shoving people around. The civil suit against the ARCHDICCESE OF SANTA FE and BOB has been thrown out of court. It appears that the latest 'name of the game' for greedy lawyers is 'Sue the Catholic Church'. We are assured by our ecumenical brethren that there are even more suits against the Protestant Churches, but that they hardly ever make the media. It would appear that the motivation in our cases is a combination of hatred of the Church, and of vengeance, jealousy and greed on the part of many of the 'victims'.
