




A few words about the first issue of Volume XXX.

Minutes of 1992 Annual Meeting

Our esteemed brother President, FR. FRANK NEMMERS, opened our 29th meeting with a prayer at 8:00 PM Wed., July 8th at the Memorial Hall of HOOD COLLEGE in FREDERICK, Maryland. Our Convention Host was FR. PETER J SWEENEY. 35 members were present along with 3 associate members and 3 guests.

- I. TREASURER'S REPORT: A balance of \$6,183.33 as of 4/30/92. (Fr. Bill Roche, April 1992 newsletter report). (Further details are found on separate sheets in this newsletter). 1) Discussion followed as to our Investment Plan and the possibility of investment in a Mutual Fund. FR. PAT PATTEN also mentioned Fidelity Groups and the Magellan Fund. No action was taken.
- 2) After discussion it was decided that we were not able to make our customary GIFT of \$1,000.00 to one of our missionary members this year due to low earnings on our investments. 3) MOTION: by FR. JOHN Walsh, second by FR. EV HEMANN: THAT THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE DETERMINE WHAT AMOUNT WE COULD DONATE THIS YEAR. Vote: Unanimously in the Affirmative. 4) MOTION: by FR. BOB KIRSCH; seconded by FR. JOHN WOLESKY THAT WHATEVER AMOUNT WE CAN GIVE BE DONATED TO FATHER PAT PATTEN FOR HIS MEDICAL FLYING SERVICE. Vote: Unanimously in favor.
- II. OLD BUSINESS: 1) FR. BOB KIRSCH gave a report on the untimely death of our member, BISHOP JOSE' A. LLAGUNO FARIAS, S.J., from cancer on February 26, 1992. BISHOP LLAGUNO had had every intention of being with us this year. Man proposes and God disposes. He had sent his blessing and kindest regards and he was surely with us in spirit. The mission airplane flown by BISHOP LLAGUNO, a Cherokee Dakota 235, XB-ETB, is parked on the ramp at Chihuahua City in the State of Chihuahua, Mexico. The plane is kept in tip-top shape as a donation by the FBO of our friends, SERVICIO AEREO LOPEZ, S.A. Senor LEO LOPEZ, Jr. and his late father have been good friends of our mission aviation for some 30 years. Six of our members, along with several of our parishes, have been supporting the Bishop's plane for several years. Presently we are still awaiting the naming of the new Bishop of TARAHUMARA and TEPUAN Peoples. This man will decide as to the future use of the plane. FR. PEPE MARTIN DEL CAMPO is a mountain pilot and he may be operating the plane for the Vicariate. As of now everything is on hold. 2) FR. AL RUSCHMAN informed us that NAPP is still a Corporation in the State of Kentucky. 3) FR. MARK TILLIA (Brazil) sent his regards to all. Due to changing conditions he is not flying presently.
- III. REGIONAL REPORTS: 1). EASTERN: No report except that of "NOTA BENE", i.e. FR. PETE SMEENEY is still a member in good standing having paid his dues at his customary "eleventh hour. We welcome from this region a new associate member, NANCY "RED" GUERNSEY, a Divinity Student for the priesthood in the Episcopal Church. 2) MIDWESTERN: Our brothers of this region report that their Fall Regional Neeting will be held on October 12 at LARCHWOOD, Iowa. Also, MR. JOE MURRAY (brother of FATHERS ED and GENE) is a new associate member of NAPP. A warm welcome to JOE MURRAY. 3) WESTERN: FR. RICHARD OLONA, Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, N.M., soon to be a licensed private pilot, has been received as a new member of NAPP. We are most pleased to welcome FR. RICHARD OLONA!
- IV. 1) FR. PETER J. SWEENEY was acclaimed with much appreciation on the

part of all present for a wonderful Convention with much attention being given to the individual needs and interests of each person. Also warmly recognized were Fr. Pete's able Assistants, HARRY DOWN, FRANK LACKNY and LUCY STOKESBURY. Bless them all !! 2) 1993 CONVENTION SITE: According to our time-honored tradition we go from east (1992) back to the mid-country area. SAN ANTONIO, Texas has been proposed for 1993. FR. TOM WEINZAPFEL, our member in Dallas, Texas. would not be able to host the Convention because of "his years". However, FR. JOHN HEMANN is in contact with his close friend, FR. PAUL C. McDONALD in San Antonio and it appears at this time that the 1993 Convention will be in SAN ANTONIO, Texas on Tuesday and Wednesday, July 6th and 7th, please the Lord. (We will conscientiously mark our calendars, will we not, like now, please!) For 1993 a little hop over to the MOONEY Factory at KERRVILLE, Texas was suggested. FR. BOB KIRSCH volunteered the help of the N.M. contingent, if needed. 3) For 1994: FR. MIKE NASH and FR. GENE MURRAY suggested that we might meet under the able direction of FR. BILL ROCHE at Menlo Park Seminary in the lower San Francisco Bay area. 4) And what foresight and daring! For 1995 FR. FRANK NEMMERS mentioned that the BAHAMAS might be a possibility. Through WINGS OF HOPE, we of MAPP have been instrumental in providing BISHOP BURKE with an airplane. He would be a charming and appreciative host.

MOTION; THAT NOMINATIONS BE CLOSED (FR. BILL ROCHE has indicated that he would be pleased to be succeeded)) by FR. TONY ATTEA: Second by NANCY "RED" GUERNSEY. Vote: Unanimously in favor. Congratulations to FR. EV. FR. BILL ROCHE was saluted in appreciation for his conscientious efforts in minding the "money bags."

VI. ACCLAIM and APPRECIATION: 1). To HOOD COLLEGE and CATHERINE NICOLATO, Directress of the Summer Program at HOOD COLLEGE and the Young Ladies who served so effectively at the Convention Desk. 2) To Banquet Speaker MSGR. HUGH PHILLIPS for his excellent historical presentation; 3) To speaker BERNIE FUNK and to AOPA President PHIL BOYER who so generously shared their time with us. 4) to FR. MIKE HURRAY for the super efficient briefing and planning of the exciting and enjoyable mass flight of some eight planes to TANGIER ISLAND off the Maryland\Virginia coasts. 5) To all three HEMANN BROTHERS for the press releases and media exposure. 6) To FR. BOB SENNOTT and FR. JACK LAWLER who were recognized in absentia. FR. JACK unfortunately broke his leg. We hope to see them both in SAN ANTONE, God willing!

<u>VII. COMMENDATION</u>: Our noble and dedicated Editor of our Newsletter, FR. MEL HEMANN, was again, and as always with much merit, loudly applauded by all the assembled brethren.



Bishop James W. Malone has announced that the Rev. Michael Mikstay has been commissioned as a lieutenant in the chaplain corps of the Navy for a three-year term. Father Mikstay is a native of Canton and has served as associate pastor at Holy Family Parish in Poland since 1968.

He will begin his Navy commitment with special training in July at Newport, R.I. In September he will start service with the Second Marine Division at Camp Lejeune in North Carolina.

BACKGROUND: Before his service at Holy Family, he was associate pastor at St. Paul Parish in Salem and at St. Aloysius Parish in East Liverpool.

After completing St. Paul Grade School in Canton and St. Thomas Aquinas High School, he earned his bachelor's from St. Gregory College and a master's degree in biblical studies from Mount St. Mary Seminary. He was ordained in 1981 in Youngstown.

Father Mikstay was a member of the Diocesan Liturgical Commission and is a member of the Diocesan Priests Council.











WASHINGTON MONUMENT, CAPITOL, JEFFERSON MEMORIAL, I.C. SHRINE







